

Spaces

- Spaces is new to Mac OS X 10.5 Leopard.
- It allows you to have as many as 16 different working areas
 - each able to run several applications at once
 - or display a single application in full screen.
- It is activated through Expose and Spaces in System Preferences.



- You can set up the shortcuts to activate the space you want from the preferences panel.
- I have mine as command–arrow keys.
- And also command–number keys (number of the space)
- Once an application is up and running (I'll open iPhoto) you can drag it to different Spaces by holding down on its title bar and pulling it to the edge of the screen in the direction of the Space you want.
 - So, to move iPhoto from Space 1 to Space 2, you would take it to the right-hand edge of your screen and hold it there for a second until the new Space slides into view.

Another quick tip I found recently:

With the assigned keys on your keyboard: (all the F keys at the top with pictures on them.) These are shortcuts for many functions, ie the volume adjustment keys, the screen brightness keys on the laptop, the backlit key brightness on macbook pro. if you push the option key and then push one of these function keys, it will open up system preferences to the window that controls that function! Presto! If there are different tabs in the preference window, you may need to change the tab to access the function you wish to adjust.
